RESULTS & CONCLUSION

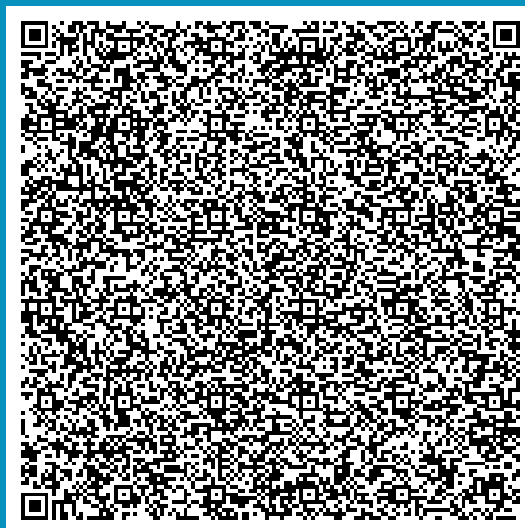
Currently in dissemination:
